1's Pipped for finals berth after undefeated 2007!

5th - 11 matches - 6 wins (incl. 2 outright) - 1 draw - 4 losses (incl. 1 outright)

The final round saw the Snowdogs (4th) up against arch-rival Avondale Heights (3rd) who had the wood on our boys over the years especially after the big semi-final showdown last year! Revenge was on the mind of the lads as they took to the final round to try and secure a finals berth, keep the 2007 undefeated streak going and end the finals chances of the team who ended our shot at glory last year! Cully won the toss and decided to bat on a usual belter at Canning Street. The top order were very solid with the top 5 all making double figures with Pants-man Hellard notching a well-made 50 with Ossie (16) and Cully (28) providing great assistance and a launching pad after tea with wickets in hand. Siffy came and went very entertainingly, slapping Doddsy first ball he faced for one of the biggest 6's you will see, only to be bowled 4 balls later. The enter "The Brains trust" who combined for a valuable 88 runs in the later stages of our innings, mighty (49), Strongbow Kassis (22) and Ruley (17) allowed a very competitive score of 228 as Chisel being a great older brother comically run out Rowdy for a diamond duck to sew up the duck award for this season!

In reply, it was always going to be a key first hour with the top order of Avondale their key with their openers, skipper and Popov gun bats! But some great opening bowling from Chisel (3/24) and an unlucky G-tram got rid of the key man in Dodds for just 8. Rowdy then took one of the years best catches in gully outstretched whilst catching some frequent flyers to dismiss O'Reilly and the boys were "up and about." The pressure in the field the boys mounted through dot balls then saw two run-outs take place in the matter of balls to be right on top and have the brittle lower order of Avondale to come. Ossie (2/2) quickly wrapped up the tail after lunch to dismiss the Heights out of the game and finals for just 80. With news filtering through of results not going our way in other games, the follow on was enforced as the Dogs chased the outright win, but failed; ending the days play and season with Avondale 2/166. A crushing win by the boys to get some revenge on Avondale but a hollow victory knowing a great finish to the season ended prematurely!

2nd XI miss chance to defend title after unable to secure last round outright

7th - 11 matches - 5 wins (1 outright) - 1 draw - 5 losses

Needing an outright win against the bottom placed Avondale to make the finals, AJ and the boys went about achieving the gettable win by bowling and having 4 early wickets all thanks to Millsy (7/62). Couple big middle order partnerships so the outright win slowly slipping away as Avondale managed to knock up a competitive 207, making the outright win possibly beyond reach. Millsy's huge bag was a great effort and no doubt a senior cricket best bowling performance with the 7-wicket haul. In the run chase an early collapse saw Garthy, Ivan and Bourkey combine for 1 run between them but the skipper steadied the ship with Jordo making 44 and well supported in the middle order by Barge Serrano (53), Tom O (30), BJ (25) and a 40* for Bulldog Connor as the dogs made 7/229 before declaring and having a last ditch crack at an outright but only managing to have Avondale 2/52 in the 2nd innings. Unfortunately no title defence could occur for the 2nd XI but a consistent year was had, unearthing some future 1st XI kids in the side in what was an even race for the finals!

3rd XI finals chances fade away in final rounds!

9th - 11 matches - 4 wins - 2 draws - 4 losses (1 outright)

The 3rd's last round match was reduced to a 1-day game after a wet pitch day 1, Trave won the toss and batted however after his early dismissal for a duck it was not the start wanted. The Boong (26) and Raff (45) steadied the ship early on for the boys to allow wickets in hand for the likes of Coxy (35), Barge (14) and Scatters (41) to unleash in the closing overs to make a big score of 9/206 of the allocated 36 overs. In reply, Spotswood were steady the whole way through with 7 of their top 8 making 15-25's but were always behind the required run rate and when wickets came they were generally taken consecutively by the boys to keep the opposition always on the

back foot. The best of the bowlers were Kev (2/16) and Scatters capped a good all-round game off with 2/30. A solid year for the 3rds in another even finals race however the gap between the best and the worst of the 3's was seen to be the difference in the losses they had!

4th XI Last ditch effort for finals fail after a huge season

5th - 14 matches - 7 wins (1 outright) - 1 draw - 6 losses

Another outright win was the order of the day for our 4th XI also to make finals after a sensational year on-field considering the struggle for numbers we had! Jayers decided to bat first in attempt to set a huge score and bowl the opposition out twice for the win and a good start was achieved by Luv-30 (14) and Zacca (26) with some solid middle-late order batting from Radders (48) and Hughesy (20) compiling a competitive score of 9/227 from the full 72 overs. With the ball the boys needed early wickets and got that indeed having Youlden at 5/68 and eventually bowling them out for 109 in the 1st dig thanks to the young genius leggies of Liam 'Protégé' Jilla (4/22) and Nick Hughes adding to his solid batting with 3/5. Jayers sent Youlden back in after still 100+ runs behind and with overs in hand an outright and finals berth was on. However, an outright are hard to get (unless teams fall over ;) and the boys could only manage to have Youlden at 4/165 at stumps and join the rest of the club for an early break up drink! A fantastic effort by Jayers to captain the 4's this year in not only getting 11 players each week but being competitive and nearly sneaking a finals berth, great work Jayers and he was ably assisted at times by Phil Conlan and Kev O'Connell!

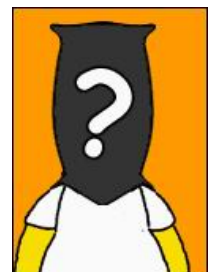

Thanks again to all that entered and supported the club and the effort that Nick did to run this, great job barge and let's all get behind the similar concept next season!

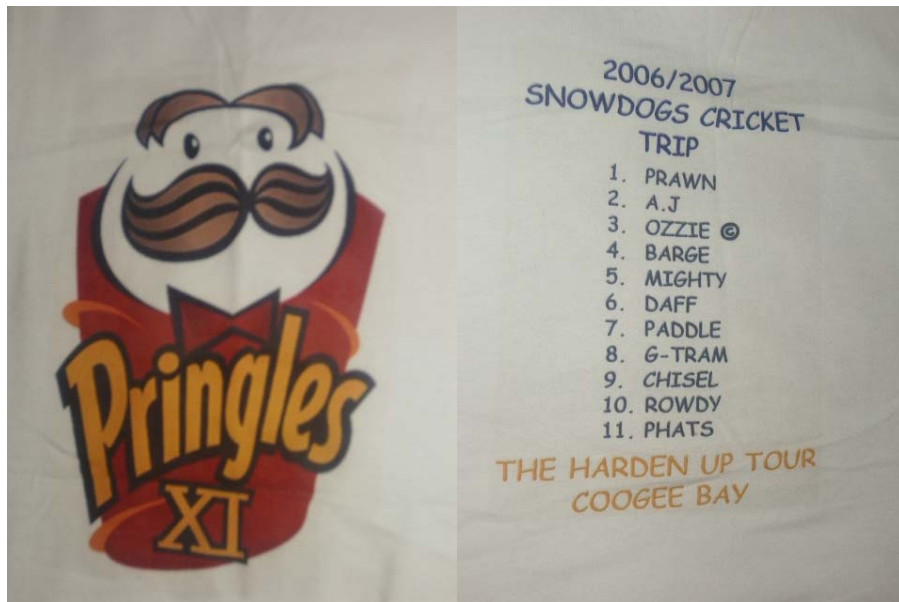
